Worship Associates Program Application Information

Thank you for your interest in the Worship Associates Program. Because worship is such an important part of the life of the church, the Worship Associates Program has been established to help support the enrichment and development of the worship experience in the course of the formal church year (9 months) through a shared ministry.

The Ministry of a Worship Associate

- Quarterly planning for minister-led services including themes and topics for each service requiring monthly meetings, currently the first Saturday of each month from August through May, at 8-10 AM.
- Acting as **liturgist** (from the root word meaning "the work of the people), being the *Reader and Responsive Reading Leader* in a service.
- Taking **responsibility** for assisting the minister in *one or more services* each quarter.
- Working with the minister one-on-one on the content of the service, including readings that pertain to the established theme of the service.
- Assisting in **quality assessment** for past services. This includes seeking and bringing back thoughts and suggestions from members of the congregation.
- Reflecting the **diverse worship needs** of the congregation in the development of services through worship arts mini-workshop sessions during the regular meeting time.
- Assist in **organizing the 12 lay-led summer services**, and giving assistance to those leading the service.

Aside from the rewarding aspect of this ministry, a consistent level of commitment is required on the part of the individual Worship Associate. Regular meeting attendance is necessary to meet the organizational and planning requirements of the ministry of the group. Setting aside the time and energy to serve as the liturgist is also important. By evenly dividing the responsibilities for service planning among the Worship Associates, the ministries of the individual members remain manageable and enjoyable.

Program Specifics and Terms of service

A limited number of Worship Associates (9 to 12) will be chosen through a process of application and review. Worship Associates serve a two (2) year term and have the option of reapplying and serving consecutive terms if they so desire.

Benefits

The benefits of being a Worship Associate are many. In addition to the plentiful opportunities for planning and participating in worship services, training is provided in the worship arts including pubic speaking. Because of the creative and theological nature of this ministry, the fellowship among the Worship Associates is rich and dynamic. As part of the shared ministry of the church, Worship Associates enjoy the opportunity to work more closely with members of the congregation and the minister for the purpose of better reflecting the personal and spiritual needs of the congregants in the worship experience.
