
At our request, a professional native landscaper has created this plan for transformation of our front gardens. It's a solid plan, backed by knowledge and lengthy experience.

But in reality, the long process of doing this transforming work ourselves, step-by-step, may be the only way we will manifest our dream. The long process may also be the truest expression of our caring relationships, and of our commitment to stewardship of the interdependent web of all existence of which we are most definitely an integral part. Knowing that so many in our congregation share a deep connection with the natural world, we want to keep you informed of our plans, and invite you to join us on this journey.

Donations gratefully received by our Honduran partners

Since the Trivia Night in January to raise money for the residents of the Cangrejal River Valley in Honduras, the Honduras Group has been able to make generous donations to three entities.

\$1,000 was donated to the micro-finance organization Adelante. This amount will allow five women in the villages where UUCC groups participated in projects and built latrines to learn about micro finance in weekly classes and to start saving and spending money towards bettering their lives.

\$250 was donated to the health clinic in El Pital. In Honduras this amount goes a long way, and they were able to purchase asthma medication, several kinds of antibiotics, vitamins, and basic medical supplies. When these supplies are used up, we will send them another \$250.

Upcoming Workshop: 'Healthy Conflict Resolution'

9 to 11 a.m. Saturday, May 2 Breakfast provided Childcare available with advance request (Request by April 30)

The Committee on Ministry (COM) invites you to its quarterly leadership breakfast and training.

The topic of this event will be "Healthy Conflict Resolution." The training will be led by your Peace Building Team from 9 to 11 a.m. Saturday, May 2 in the Greeting Area at church. The event is open to all, no matter your role in our shared community.

The primary purpose of the Committee on Ministry is to promote the spiritual health and wellbeing of UUCC. In that role the committee is working to develop leadership, build commitment to shared ministry, and help our congregation work to fulfill the mission of our church. Cooperative and Community Center, and with it and the loan described below, they purchased a new vehicle in order to be able to deliver their wares around the country. Their sales went down significantly when their vehicle broke down over a year ago, and the new vehicle will make a huge difference for many families in the area.

We sent the cooperative \$1,000 as a loan, which is to be repaid by making school uniforms for children who can't afford them and wouldn't be going to school without them. Principals and teachers in the schools will be working together with the women of the cooperative to identify the children in need.

Many thanks to the members and friends of UUCC who donate so generously – it is making a huge difference in one of the poorest countries in our hemisphere.

Grieving Circle launched

Grieving Circle is a new small group recently launched at UUCC. It is a safe, affirming place for those with broken or aching hearts to share their grief, whether out loud or in silence.

Our Grieving Circle will meet twice per month, once for a daytime meeting and once for an evening meeting:

• **Daytime:** 1:30 p.m. on the second Wednesday of each month.

• **Evening:** 7 p.m. on the fourth Thursday of each month.

This group will be open on a drop-in basis, so that anyone may come or not as they feel moved. There will be a chalice lighting and a reading to provide some structure, but the main purpose of the group is to be present together and accompany each other through the winding path of grief.

Grieving Circle is open to those grieving *any* kind of loss. All are very welcome. The group is cofacilitated by Rev. Molly Housh Gordon, Maria Oropallo, and Barbara Carter.

Our May meetings will be held at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, May 13 and 7 p.m. Thursday, May 28 at church. All are welcome at one or both.

We Outdid Ourselves!

With great joy and pride in our community, the Stewardship Team thanks everyone who pledged and helped make this year's annual stewardship campaign a truly astounding one.

At the outset, we set an ambitious goal of 100% pledging, and we received a record 164 pledges – a stunning 96% of potential pledgers. Wow! Your pledges show that our community truly understands that we are all in this together.

Here are two more amazing facts:

• Excluding our largest pledge, the average pledge this year was \$1,544, an increase of 40% over last year's average of \$1,103.

• We received pledges from a record 33 first-time pledgers.

And a final stunning fact: We not only reached, but surpassed our \$260,000 dollar goal to fully fund our needs in the coming church year. **Total pledges are now \$287,625!**

Your generosity will allow us to substantially expand our Religious Education staff position, provide adequate resources for our many wonderful ministries and programs, and make a modest start on rebuilding badly depleted reserve funds needed for unforeseen and emergency expenses.

We hoped for a good result, but with your help, together we all picked up our oars and sailed this campaign right off the map into the kind of abundance we only dreamed about.

Green Sanctuary Team news



The Transportation Group of Green Sanctuary Team has launched "Travel a Different Path," asking congregants to be mindful of the environmental impact of cars. We want to draw attention to alternative transportation and ride-sharing.

We chose four Sundays to "travel a different path," two in April and two in May. For **April 19**, we asked that people park a quarter to half mile away from the church and walk that distance to church. For **April 26**, we asked that people do the above plus carpool or explore carpooling options with neighbors.

Please join us in May for continued efforts to reduce the number of cars used to travel to church and to reduce parking lot use. For **May 3**, continue the above, and if your partner needs to be at church earlier or stay later, a quiet place will be provided to work or so-cialize while you wait. For **May 10**, continue the above and/or bike, walk, or wheel to church.

The pamphlet "Mindful Journeys" is available in the greeting area. Please pick one up and explore more options for traveling to church. The present average "people to vehicle" ratio is 1.7. As the congregation becomes more mindful of how we travel to church, we can improve that to a ratio of 2! If you have questions or ideas please contact Jan Weaver, Allie Gassmann or Ellen Thomas.

GS would like to partner with Slow Food Katy Trail and Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture in their Harvest of the Month Program that takes place in several of Columbia's elementary schools. Harvest of the Month brings together farmers, students and teachers. Each time a farmer gives a short presentation, introducing students to local foods and teaching them easy preparation of seasonal produce and products.

We need volunteers to commit two hours once a month for nine months during the 2015-16 academic year to help students pour, stir, and cook, and to stimulate discussion about seasonal vegetables, healthy eating, and the importance of farmers. Please contact Lisa Guillory for more information.


Nursery Care for Summer Services
