# The capacity to acknowledge error and change

Error is a hardy plant; it flourishes in every soul.

- Martin F. Tupper

My spouse and I have a shorthand for when one of us feels very, very certain the other is wrong. It all goes back to an argument about an actor in a short part in a movie. James was sure the actor was David Bowie. I was sure he was not... so sure that I objected vehemently even to the unimpeachable evidence of Google. Of course Google was right, and though I still cringe to say it, so was James – he nearly always is, when it comes to movie trivia.

Now, whenever one of us doubles down in error (which we regularly do), the other will simply pose an innocent reminder: "David Bowie." Without fail, the mention of his name causes the righteous to relent – yes, I could be wrong.

This quality of spiritual maturity requires, at its core, humility. It requires that we acknowledge our deep and abiding fallibility – the fact that we have erred, will err, and are probably right at this moment standing upon some error or failure or wrong.

The paradox of this quality is this: It is precisely through our errors that the most growth is possible... as long as we are willing to change. After all, even the evolution of life itself is a grand series of genetic mistakes! Without error, nothing new can emerge.

So this month I chant, "David Bowie. David Bowie." This reminder of my folly and my mistakes will (almost) certainly help me grow.

# Calling members to serve as delegates

Our church community, as many of you know, is part of a larger whole. Specifically, we are members in good standing with the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA), and our church is one of nearly 200 UU congregations in the UUA's MidAmerica Region.

Both the UUA and the district have annual assemblies – the General Assembly is held by the UUA, and the regional assembly is for churches and fellowships in our region. Many of our church members have attended these assemblies and come back with valuable information for us.

Important voting happens at these events. As a full member of the UUA, we can appoint a number of delegates to attend and vote at the assemblies (proxy voting is allowed). UUCC and other congregations may appoint a delegate for every 50 members of the church. For us, that means five delegates (we currently have 251 members).

It's about time to start considering who is interested in attending. Specifics on both assemblies:

- Regional Assembly will be in the Chicago area April 28-30.
- General Assembly will be in New Orleans June 21-25.

Further details about both assemblies are available on the Web at <u>uua.org</u> and <u>mid-americauua.org</u>.

According to a board policy adopted in May 2014, the Nominating Committee may recruit and nominate members to attend these assemblies – ultimately, the Board of Trustees approves delegates. Traditionally, the church will pay for the registration fees for our delegates and "will endeavor" to defray travel and lodging costs as we are able.



# Something New in R.E.!

This semester in R.E., we are trying something new. Well, actually, two things new! First, we are going to be offering R.E. during the 9 a.m. service starting Feb. 5. Second, at this 9 a.m. time, we will be experimenting with a new way of doing religious education. The curriculum is called "Spirit Play," and it is based on a Montessori approach to learning that encourages self-directed exploration and allows children to engage deeply with their own religious education in a way that meets their own individual needs and interests.

This semester, we will have one mixed-aged class, most appropriate for children ages 3-9. The class is structured to begin with a time of storytelling that is accompanied by a series of props and materials that are used to help narrate the story. After the story is complete, the children will have the chance to play with the materials from the week's story as well as the materials from other stories.

All our stories this semester will focus on the theme of heroes and heroines. Imagine your young one playing out the story of Bree Newsome's heroic climb up the Charleston flag pole to remove the Confederate flag, Julia Butterfly living in an old growth redwood tree for two years to save it from loggers, or Martin Luther King's courageous stand for voting rights at Selma. I am so excited to get to see our children's imaginations at work, making these stories their own!

Additionally, there will be other materials in the room to let children engage however their interests lie – from building models of sacred places out of blocks to "playing church" with their own pulpit and chalice, to painting pictures that arise from the creativity of their souls, to taking part in scientific exploration of our beautiful and fascinating world. I can't wait to see them explore!
