Annual Meeting May 6

The Board of Trustees has scheduled the annual congregational meeting on Sunday, May 6 after the 11 a.m. worship service. At the meeting members will vote on the following items:

- Approval of the proposed 2018-19 operating budget
- Election of Board of Trustees members

• Approval of a revision to the Investments and Endowment Policy

Other business will include a report on the status of the Building Needs Task Force and presentation of annual reports.

The three candidates for three-year seats on the Board of Trustees are Mark Johnson, Elaine Martin and Mindy McPherson. Other candidates may be nominated from the floor at the meeting.

Members who joined before March 6 this year will be eligible to vote at the meeting in person or by proxy. The quorum for the meeting will be 49 members present in person or by proxy.

President's Perspective Mark your calendar for annual meeting and G.A.

We have two major events in the life of our church in May and June. On Sunday, **May 6**, we will have our annual congregational meeting. The two standard and very important responsibilities we have at all these meetings are to elect new board members and approve our annual operating budget for the 2018-2019 church year. Also on the agenda are a proposal to amend the bylaws to add a statement of purpose to the endowment fund provisions and a report from our facilities needs team. It is important for voting members to attend because we must have a quorum to conduct business at the meeting.

The Nominating Committee has presented a slate of three qualified candidates to fill the three open slots. Mark Johnson, who is completing his first three-year term, has agreed to serve another three years if elected (the bylaws limit board members to two consecutive three-year terms). Mindy McPherson, who is currently filling the last six months of the term of a board member who resigned, has agreed to run for a full term. Elaine Martin, a long-time member who has served in numerous volunteer capacities for our congregation, has also agreed to run.

The Nominating Committee makes recommendations for all vacant board positions. But this does not mean these are the only people who can run. We welcome additional nominations from the floor at the meeting.

The big event in June is the annual Unitarian Universalist Association General Assembly **June 20-24**. This year is special because it is in Kansas City, meaning it is much more affordable for our members to attend all or a portion of the meeting. I have never been before, but I'm going this year! I have heard from prior attendees that it is a great experience of powerful worship, great workshops, and fun. You can find details at <u>https://www.uua.org/ga</u>. Hurry! Early registration at a lower cost ends May 1.

Sponsored by the Green Sanctuary Team At Katfish Katy's on the Missouri River at Huntsdale


Worship Service – 10 a.m. • Potluck Brunch – 11 a.m.

How to Enter Katfish Katy's

There are now locked gates limiting access to Katfish Katy's Campground. Here is how to enter into and exit from the campground on June 3:

When you drive through Huntsdale on Route O and approach the campground, you will see a metal gate directly in front of you that leads to the Station House Restaurant. *Do not try to go through this gate*.

Instead, follow the road to the left (south) and enter by the next gate that leads to the boat ramp. Someone will be waiting between 9:30 and 10 a.m. at that next gate to let you in with a key card. Plan to arrive no later than 9:45 a.m. – this means leaving Columbia by 9:15 a.m. at the latest.

If you arrive later than 10 a.m. and there is no one at the gate, call Patty Daus at 573-529-9691 or Peter Holmes at 573-239-7789.

After going through the gate at the road, drive toward the boat ramp area. You will encounter a second gate that opens automatically for vehicles. After going through this second gate, proceed to the boat ramp area and then follow the road to the right until you reach the point where a road to the left goes over the levee and leads to the picnic/camping area where we will gather.

While the gate at the road requires a key card to enter the campground, it opens automatically for vehicles to exit.

Special Instructions for Cyclists

If you are cycling on the Katy Trail, you will already be inside the gate from the road. You will encounter the gate leading to the boat ramp that opens automatically for vehicles, but it will not open for a bicycle. If no one is there with a key card to open this gate for you, there is a space where you can go around the fence on the left side of the gate.
