#### Sponsored by the Green Sanctuary Team At Katfish Katy's on the Missouri River at Huntsdale


Worship Service – 10 a.m. • Potluck Brunch – 11 a.m.

We will mainly be under the trees, like last year, but a sunhat might be a good idea.

#### How to Enter Katfish Katy's

There are now locked gates limiting access to Katfish Katy's Campground. Here is how to enter into and exit from the campground on June 3:

When you drive through Huntsdale on Route O and approach the campground, you will see a metal gate directly in front of you that leads to the Station House Restaurant. *Do not try to go through this gate*.

*Instead*, follow the road to the left (south) and enter by the next gate that leads to the boat ramp. Someone will be waiting between 9:30 and 10 a.m. at that next gate to let you in with a key card. Plan to arrive no later than 9:45 a.m. – this means leaving Columbia by 9:15 a.m. at the latest.

If you arrive later than 10 a.m. and there is no one at the gate, call Patty Daus at 573-529-9691 or Peter Holmes at 573-239-7789.

After going through the gate at the road, drive toward the boat ramp area. You will encounter a second gate that opens automatically for vehicles. After going through this second gate, proceed to the boat ramp area and then follow the road to the right until you reach the point where a road to the left goes over the levee and leads to the picnic/camping area where we will gather.

While the gate at the road requires a key card to enter the campground, it opens automatically for vehicles to exit.

#### Special Instructions for Cyclists

If you are cycling on the Katy Trail, you will already be inside the gate from the road. You will encounter the gate leading to the boat ramp that opens automatically for vehicles, but it will not open for a bicycle. If no one is there with a key card to open this gate for you, there is a space where you can go around the fence on the left side of the gate.

# **REflections**

This month, the theme of our church is the importance of making time for solitude in creating a community. I think all of us who have children appreciate the glorious solitude when your child finally lets you use the bathroom alone. It is incredibly important for us parents to find time for solitude, and also for our children. Particularly for those of us who are more introverted, solitude is necessary and important self-care for



being part of a family, a church community, and a greater world community. It is important to take time to reconnect with ourselves, to find quiet to hear our inner voice, and to regroup and renew our energy. How can you help your child learn to appreciate solitude?

- Take the whole family to a place of natural beauty or interest, and spread out, each finding a spot alone to draw a picture or record what you see. Come back to share your individual discoveries. Try switching to each others' spots before comparing notes to see what you saw that was the same and what you saw that was different.
- Teach your child about journaling. Remind them that a journal doesn't have to be a record of everything you did in a day. It can be one thing that you are grateful for, or one emotion that you felt. Even a very young child can choose a color that a day felt like and draw with that color in a journal.
- Find time to just lie in the grass in the backyard, or floating on a raft in a pool or wherever you feel peacefully alone.


