



In the spirit of courageous love we forge a community of radical welcome and deep connection that moves us together to heal the world.





- Recommend next steps






Challenges:

- Facility not fully accessible
- Small parking lot
- Sunday mornings crowded inside and outside of sanctuary
- Desire to reduce fossil fuel dependence and be green
- Inadequate meeting spaces
- Limited calm, quiet sacred space indoors





UUCC Attendance Data

- 1) Experts tell us that once the seats in the sanctuary are >80% full, the space will "feel" full and visitors will not feel welcomed;
- 2) Currently our sanctuary has a 120-140 seating capacity;
- 3) The data below reflect the adults in attendance at both (9 & 11 am) services, but not the children;
- 4) For most Sundays the # of children at the start of the 11 am service exceeds the # of adults at the 9 am service.



Despite growth in membership Sunday service attendance has peaked.

The facility needs to reflect the congregation's missional radical welcome and make it manifest in UUCC's built environment.






Recommendations for Next Steps

- 1. Gather robust data on congregational growth and giving
- 2. Revisit what you need for your facility in light of new data and other information
- 3. Reduce anxiety about talking about money
- 4. Create a Strategic Financial Forecast
- Recruit a Capital Campaign Team and begin your journey toward a facility that more clearly reflects your mission and your values

- If we were more fully living our mission of radical welcome and deep connection what would we look like?





Master Plans Simon Oswald Architecture

Congregational Input



Congregational Input (continued)


In small group share ideas with each other:

- Money story sessions...



Fall 2020

- Rev. Molly returns;
- Building plans gelled;
- Educate congregation about building plans and campaign process;

- Conduct Feasibility Study and report results.




Winter/Spring 2021

- Conduct stewardship visits.
