We Are Rising to the Moment by...

Nurturing Each Other

These last two years have pulled back the thin veil over our culture's attitude toward nurture and caregiving. As our institutions have continually failed to adequately support nurses, teachers, child caregivers, home health and nursing home caregivers, parents, and others during a time of profound challenge, we have been reminded that caregiving is not uplifted or valued in the systems that make up our lives.

Yet we have realized in the same moment that everything about our society, economy and culture relies upon a foundation of caregiving. Nothing works without it.

What would it be like to rebuild our culture around nurture? Small communities, like our congregation, could be a perfect trial ground for this question. Already we are a people who help each other with meals and childcare, who invest in one another is spiritual growth, and who show up for one another in times of need. How can we extend that prioritization of care even beyond our walls – showing up with soup on the street and hugs at the protest? What kind of culture of nurture can we imagine?

Let's care together this month – my guess is it could change everything.

The past few weeks, as the Omicron wave has forced us apart once again, I am reminded how much I need community. Not just because I need people to love and care for me, but because I need to love and care for other people. As I look ahead to Valentine's Day, I was thinking of the old song we used to sing for Valentine's Day in my childhood choir: "Love is something when we give it away...we end up having more." And I think not just that we receive love back from other people, but that as we ourselves become instruments of love, it suffuses our being

and heals our own souls and makes love more abundant in our being.

There is something in the culture of white supremacy that tries to tell us that it is wrong to admit need, to say we rely on others. If there was one thing I have most wanted to tell you this year, it is that you are giving people a gift when you openly



acknowledge your need for care. You are giving them an opportunity to care.

So this month, let us open up fully to caring for each other, and to being cared for by each other. You and your children are loved by this community. You and your children are loved by me. Truly and deeply. I look forward to seeing you again this month.
