Minister's Message

On the 8th Principle

I want to tell you today about a movement in Unitarian Universalism called the 8th Principle Project, which is a grassroots part of our faith tradition's work for collective liberation, and which is encouraging UUs across the nation in our shared work of becoming more free.

In 1984 our association voted to adopt seven principles to guide our shared life together, in which we would covenant together to affirm and promote:

1. The inherent worth and dignity of every person;

2. Justice, equity and compassion in human relations;

3. Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations;

4. A free and responsible search for truth and meaning;

5. The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large;

6. The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all;

7. Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.

Compelled by the spiritual necessity of work for collective liberation, Black leaders in Unitarian Universalism have proposed an 8th Principle: "Journeying toward spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions."

Safety guidelines for in-person worship

After a hiatus in January caused by the spike of cases of the Omicron Covid variant, we resumed inperson services on Feb. 6, and we continue to offer live-streamed services. All are invited to attend in the format that best meets their needs and risk tolerance.

For those attending in person, we are continuing the following in-person safety measures:

• Masks are required for those 2 and older. We recommend high quality masks such as N-95, KN-95 or KF-94 for all who can wear them, and we will have some on hand at the church for those who need one.

• Please stay home and attend online if you feel sick - even just a little "under the weather."

• The chairs will be set up at a safe distance, and we ask you to maintain distance when not in your seat.

• Nursery caregivers and Religious Education teachers are vaccinated, boosted and masked.

143 congregations in our association have voted to adopt the 8th principle and add the work of collective liberation as a mandate for their spiritual life together. The Unitarian Universalist Association as a whole has a committee looking at the issue, and a vote likely will take place at the General Assembly in 2023.

And this year in a burst of synergy, our Board of Trustees and our high school youth independently expressed their desire to study and work toward our congregation's potential adoption of the 8th principle. The board has commissioned me to create a series of study and conversation sessions, which we hope will lead to a vote at our annual meeting. And our amazing young people are ready to help lead us.

I would argue to you that we have already begun the work of embodying the eighth principle in our life together, with the help of partner organizations like Missouri Faith Voices, partners in ministry like the Rev. Dr. CW Dawson, and the passion of our members who show up when the topic at hand is racial justice and dismantling other systems of oppression.

And I would argue to you that there is still much to be done to ferret out the ways supremacy systems live on our culture and community and our own selves. We are only beginning to imagine true freedom. And I believe this community knows that this is deeply spiritual work... that we have begun to see the cost to our souls when supremacy systems abide – to recognize that there is freedom and thriving and connection and our very humanity at stake.

I'm excited to study this new principle together. I'm eager to continue this lifelong work together. I'm overjoyed to be on this freedom journey with you. I hope you'll join me at one of this month's events!

We are proud of how our community has risen to the moment over the last two pandemic years, holding nothing back in our mission to love the world, even as we were met with some financial challenges. It felt so fulfilling to turn our building over to Room at the Inn in 2020-2021 for their most challenging sheltering season yet, to fund a Philosophy Residency and Sabbatical Ministry with Rev. Dr. C.W. Dawson, to pay more than 100 utility bills as well as other emergency needs for those most stressed in our economy, and to continue paying all of our incredible and creative staff a fair wage through an otherwise uncertain time as they helped us adapt to ever-changing circumstances!

Now, as we look ahead to an energized emergence from this time of challenge, we also need re-energize our giving! We spent down most of our surplus reserves over these last two years, and we need to replenish our funds in order to fully meet our needs.

We're asking every family who can to consider significantly increasing their annual gift so that we keep up with the good work that calls us – fully funding our budget will require us to increase congregational giving by about \$50,000 over the next two years.

We have seen first-time pledges from new members and friends and increases from 5% to 50% in some of the gifts we've already received from regular givers. We are so inspired by our community's generosity!

What are the UUA Regions?

Our Unitarian Universalist congregations are organized into regions. Each region is served by a Regional Lead and a team of Congregational Life Staff. These staff provide a wide variety of congregational services.

UUCC is a member congregation of the MidAmerica Region, which includes nearly 200 congregations in North Dakota, South Dakota, Minnesota, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska, Wisconsin, Missouri, Kentucky, Michigan, western Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois. The MidAmerica Region combined the former Central MidWest, Heartland, and Prairie Star districts.

March Festival of Sharing

For the month of March, the focus is on the "Missouri Personal Hygiene Pack". These packs are for adults who have experienced a crisis situation or are experiencing homelessness. Place all items in a large ziplock bag (2 - 2.5 gallon).

- 1 fluoride toothpaste (6 oz or more)
- 1 bath-size bar of soap (in package)
- 1 bottle skin lotion (11-14 oz)
- 1 bottle shampoo (11-14 oz)
- (Hair shampoo, NOT body shampoo, please)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 deodorant
- 2 razors (disposable)
- 1 comb or brush
- 1 hand towel

In 2020 there were requests for 4,993 packs statewide, but only 1,553 were provided. Collection boxes are available in the church Greeting Area.

Social Action Team News

Columbia's American Rescue Plan Act

Several Social Action Team members sent email letters to City Council members in February. Some were in support of a proposal by Ian Thomas and Pat Fowler for utilizing Columbia's share of the American Rescue Plan Act funds. Their proposal is called: "Providing Direct Assistance to Relieve the Conditions of Systemic Poverty and Racial Inequity and to Building Robust Pathways to Economic Security." Public input continues on the issue of how to allocate remaining ARPA funds.

Wabash bus station warming center

Letters were also sent encouraging the City to raise the threshold temperature for opening the Wabash station Warming Center, unlock the bathrooms, etc. Several of us received positive, personalized responses from our letters, most notably from Ian Thomas and Betsy Peters. I don't know if we "moved the needle" on these issues – but it does appear that at least some council members listen to their constituents.

REflections



Children in UU churches have been learning the Seven Principles for years. They probably know them better than most adult UUs. But change is afoot, and since the young people of our church have always been at the front of new ideas that make Unitarian Universalism a better, more inclusive and more just religion, I want to share about it with the children of our church.

UUs have a long and proud history of showing up to work against racism. Recently, more attention has been given to finding the way racism shows up, even without people meaning for it to, in UU

spaces, and then working to change it. Some of the most important work in UU communities in the last years has been in confronting racism in all its forms, both in the world at large and in our own UU communities. We are working to create a Beloved Community in which all are truly free and truly welcome.

And it is time to put this work front and center by naming it as one of principles. An eighth principle! A principle where we commit to working to end racism and create a Beloved Community. It is exciting, challenging and important work! And as always, I count on our young people leading the way and showing our adults what a Beloved Community could look like.
