Lilly has settled in well in her job at MU. The next most important step is to find a place for Lilly and the two kids to rent. Learning to drive and buying a car will also be important. If you are willing to help Lilly learn to drive and/or have information on cars and places to rent, please contact us!

Since it will be some time until Lilly can be independent in her transportation needs, there is currently an increased need for drivers. Host Christine Heath and co-chair Dave Gibbons are doing a lot of the transportation but will need backup drivers sometimes. Lilly needs transportation to and from work, and drivers are needed to take the family to appointments and take Lakshmi to and from her Head Start location. We put out a call for volunteers monthly, and volunteers can select when they volunteer based on their schedules. May 26, 2022 was the anniversary of UUCC welcoming Lilly, Manuel, and Lakshmi to Columbia and committing to their sponsorship. Here are some of the things on my mind that I am hoping can take flight:


- Starting an inter-generational team that meets monthly to prepare a a meal for the Mobile Soup Kitchen
