The ADA at 32

July was Disability Pride Month, and July 26 marked the 32nd anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act being signed into law. The ADA, a civil rights law for disabled people, took years of advocacy. This laborious fight included numerous meetings, phone calls, letter-writing campaigns, direct actions, and the support of countless allies. Its passage has greatly increased accessibility and inclusivity for disabled people across our country in transportation, restaurants, gyms, shops, schools and the workplace. However, we still experience daily ableism, and we still fight for access.

Columbia's buses can only transport one rider who uses a wheelchair or mobility device at a time, leaving disabled residents waiting in the heat. Accessible housing is frequently impossible to find. The lack of masking and distancing requirements during this pandemic keeps many disabled residents confined to their homes.

Issues like these regularly exclude us from society. The fight waged 32 years ago never ended, as many of us have to advocate on a – sometimes – daily basis for our rights. To gain more perspective, I recommend checking out "A Letter to the Americans with Disabilities Act on Its 32nd Birthday" by Sandy Ho on the Disability & Philanthropy website.

At UUCC, our planned elevator, automatic doors, railing and Braille signage will greatly increase access and inclusion for people with disabilities entering our building. We hope you will join us on Aug. 13 at the *UUCC Elevated Gala* and contribute as you are able to make us more radically welcoming!

Social Action Team report on fiscal year 2021-2022

The Social Action Team's budget for the 2021-22 church year was \$2,000. Here is how the Team disbursed the funds:

Henry Kirklin seminar: \$1,000. We sponsored a seminar on Columbia Center for Urban Agriculture's Henry Kirklin Black Farmer Scholarship Fund. Moderated by Rev. Dr. C.W Dawson Jr., it included presentations by Billy Polansky from CCUA and program participant Eddie Linzie. Our donation went toward the scholarship fund and for honoraria.

Honduras Educational Fund: \$500. The fund goes toward educational expenses for individuals in Honduras.

Missourians for Alternatives to the Death Penalty (MADP): \$1,000 total. A combination of funds from the Faith-to-Action collection, supplemented by the SAT budget.

Minority Men's Network (MMN): \$1,000 total. A combination of funds from the Faith-to-Action collection, supplemented by the SAT budget.

The remainder of the budget was used to bolster Faith-to-Action collections for Worley Street Roundtable and Missouri Rural Crisis Center.

Sanctuary/Immigrant Justice Team sponsorship update

Lilly and the kids have moved into their duplex. Thank you for your generosity in donating household items and helping with the move!

The move into their own apartment is another huge step, but the last step is another big one. Lilly needs to learn to drive, and she will need a car. If you are willing to help Lilly learn to drive, and/or if you have a car to sell at a low price, please let us know.

It will probably still be some time until Lilly can be independent in her transportation needs.

There is an increased need for drivers.

There is a loyal small group of drivers doing a lot of the transportation, but they need backup drivers sometimes. Lilly needs transportation to and from work, and drivers are needed to take the family to appointments and take Lakshmi to and from her Head Start location. We put out a call for volunteers monthly, and volunteers can select when they volunteer based on their schedules. May 26, 2022 was the anniversary of UUCC welcoming Lilly, Manuel and Lakshmi to Columbia and committing to their sponsorship. We are so grateful for the generosity of Christine Heath for having offered her home to the family for more than a year. One of the goals of sponsorship, however, is to help immigrants transition to independence. If Lilly did not have children, she would be well on her way. However, when we agreed to sponsor a single mom with two small children, we knew transitioning to independence would be more challenging. Consequently, our sponsorship of the family will need to continue in order to assist with rent, utilities, childcare and transportation.
