Since childhood, I've always carried with me the inherited mantra of "practice makes perfect." When it comes to spiritual practice, which is our summer worship theme, for me it's been something more like practicing imperfection.

I used to feel some frustration about the fact that I haven't found a single "that's the one!" spiritual practice. For now, I've decided to give myself permission to be imperfect, to keep experimenting with new things, to feed my soul a balanced diet, rich with variety: Prayer beads, holy texts, forest bathing, trail running, and our UUCC mindfulness meditation group on many Sunday mornings.

But through it all, I've come to realize that my ultimate spiritual practice is learning, loving and growing as part of a spiritual community. In other words, being in relationship with you is my primary spiritual practice. And for me, that practice feels just perfect.
