Let It Be a Dance: Moving Through Precarious Times

I've been feeling lately that we have entered some kind of new era. Covid-19, increasing natural disasters, and consciousness-raising movements for justice have brought more and more of our society into touch with a deep spiritual truth: Human life is precarious. Everything depends.

This has always been true, and yet it seems to become ever more true as the impacts of climate change become more deeply felt. We are entering an era of precarity, when more of us than ever feel the ways we all are tangled up with one another and the earth, and when we recognize how much hangs in the balance of that entanglement. Precarity can be frightening, but it is also full of potential. Everything we know could end; and everything unjust could change.

The trick to precarity is moving with it, rather than against it. Like a stream, it will carry us along, whether we wish it or not. But when we move with its currents, there is so much richness to be found, even now. This year, we'll be thinking together about these times as a dance. How do we move amid all that is changing and uncertain, amid all that depends? Starting in September, each month we'll explore a quality of movement that we can bring to these times.

How do we move through precarious times? Willingly. Joyfully. Collectively. Tenderly. Bravely.

Curiously. Meanderingly. Adaptively.

Join us this year to move together through it all, and let it be a dance!

Lock system changed

UUCC formerly used a key system for exterior doors. We have now fully transitioned to an automatic lock system to make our church more secure. Each week, Church Administrator April Rodeghero will update the schedule so the exterior doors will unlock and lock for scheduled activities.

Staff members, lay leaders and organizations that rent space in the church will have a code to unlock exterior doors using a keypad in order to enter the building at other times. As a backup, April has an app on her smartphone that can lock and unlock doors remotely as needed when other methods do not work.

All those who now have a key to the exterior doors are asked to turn in their keys and begin using the keypad codes that will be provided to them. Keys should be turned in to April in person or labeled with your name or group and put in April's mailbox.

It is important to turn in exterior door keys because each time a key is used, it overrides the system and causes the automatic locks to reset. This results in the doors being locked or unlocked at unscheduled times. Thus, if you are the last person to leave the church and the exterior doors are not locked, be aware that:

- The doors will lock at the scheduled time.
- A key should not be used to lock the doors because that will interrupt the schedule.

Those who have keys to interior doors in the church may keep those keys, but they are asked to inform April that they have such keys.

The year of the Hairy Petunia

This has been a rather harsh season for some of our gardens at the church. It seems that the deer have been hungry, and have ventured more than ever into our front beds, chowing down on the foliage and chomping off rising stems of purple coneflowers, yellow primroses, poppy mallows, and blazing stars. The drought is a stressor too, even for native plants, and especially for those in our traffic island surrounded by heat-radiating asphalt and lacking any source of downhill runoff. Even the little bluestem grass there is having trouble finding enough stored moisture deep in the soil.

However... have you noticed the humble hairy petunia? Apparently not as appetizing as some others, and able to thrive in harsh summer conditions, it is shading the soil, providing protective cover for other plants, feeding pollinators, and filling the beds with pale purple blooms. Yay for Ruellia humilis, the humble Hairy Petunia!
